SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Sunday was as busy, if not busier, than Saturday. Officers were kept busy most of the shift. Early in the day an officer spotted a subject driving a motorcycle without a helmet. When he attempted to stop the motorcycle, it attempted to evade the officer. Speeds reached in excess of 100mph, and the pursuit was cancelled for safety reasons. He was last seen driving south onto the freeway and CHP was advised. Officers made several arrests today, with two being for shoplifting. One case involved over \$1000 worth of merchandise, and the suspects were arrested and booked into jail on felony charges.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

The shift began with officers assisting dayshift with multiple suspects in custody for shoplifting at Kohls. SCU then located a suspect vehicle in a prior drive by shooting and

arrested the driver for possession of a firearm located in the vehicle. Later, a sinkhole was reported at Donnelly Park where a vehicle partially sunk into the hole. The parking lot was cleared out and shut down by city crew and the vehicle was towed out of the hole. Officers monitored a car meet at Tilly's with over a hundred vehicles there. They remained peaceful and cleared out after about an hour. Late in the shift, a call came in as a possible assault/battery at an apartment. A male was contacted and tried to slam the door on officers, he then spit on and headbutted an officer. He was placed in the WRAP restraint and booked in jail.
